Checklist of what to bring in on your first day of induction:

- Photographs (to be emailed to the office) of your child for their peg
- Photos of both parents and grandparents or any other adult who may collect your child on your behalf
- A few changes of clothes (labelled with your child's name)
- Spare pants or knickers if your child is potty training
- Special nappy cream, if you have one
- Formula milk and bottles (if your child is a baby)
- A buggy, with a luggage label clearly stating your child's name, if you would like to leave your buggy. We ask it is a small buggy, such as a Maclaren or Yoyo. A double buggy may be left if you have two children at the nursery.
- Paracetamol or Calpol
- Birth certificate
